



purest joys restored. Be still, my soul: when change and tears are past All safe and blessed we shall meet at last.



Moses and the Burning Bush

3 Moses was taking care of the flock of his father-in-law Jethro. Jethro was the priest of Midian. Moses led the flock to the western side of the desert. He came to Horeb. It was the mountain of God. ² There the angel of the LORD appeared to him from inside a burning bush. Moses saw that the bush was on fire. But it didn't burn up. ³ So Moses thought, "I'll go over and see this strange sight. Why doesn't the bush burn up?" ⁴ The LORD saw that Moses had gone over to look. So God spoke to him from inside the bush. He called out, "Moses! Moses!" "Here I am," Moses said. ⁵ "Do not come any closer," God said.

"Take off your sandals. The place you are standing on is holy ground." 6 He continued, "I am the God of your father. I am the God of Abraham. I am the God of Isaac. And I am the God of Jacob." When Moses heard that, he turned his face away. He was afraid to look at God. ⁷ The LORD said, "I have seen how my people are suffering in Egypt. I have heard them cry out because of their slave drivers. I am concerned about their suffering. 8 So I have come down to save them from the Egyptians. I will bring them up out of that land. I will bring them into a good land. It has a lot of room. It is a land that has plenty of milk and honey. The Canaanites, Hittites, Amorites, Perizzites, Hivites and Jebusites live there. 9 And now Israel's cry for help has reached me. I have seen how badly the Egyptians are treating them. 10 So now, go. I am sending you to Pharaoh. I want you to bring the Israelites out of Egypt. They are my people." ¹¹ But Moses spoke to God. "Who am I that I should go to Pharaoh?" he said. "Who am I that I should bring the Israelites out of Egypt?" 12 God said, "I will be with you. I will give you a sign. It will prove that I have sent you. When you have brought the people out of Egypt, all of you will worship me on this mountain .Amen

Joachim Neander was a German Reformed Church teacher, theologian and hymn writer whose most famous hymn, Praise to the Lord, the Almighty, the King of Creation has been described by John Julian in his A Dictionary of Hymnology "a magnificent hymn of praise to God, perhaps the finest creation of its author, and of the first rank in its class." Due to its popularity it was translated several times into English - Catherine Winkworth being one of the translators in the 19th century - and the hymn has appeared in most major hymnals.



Reflection

A young man who had been raised as an atheist was training to be an Olympic diver. The only religious influence in his life came from his outspoken Christian friend. The young diver never really paid much attention to his friend's sermons, but he heard them often, one night the diver went to the indoor pool at the college he attended. The lights were all off, but as the pool had big skylights and the moon was bright, there was plenty of light to practice by. The young man climbed up to the highest diving board and as he turned his back to the pool on the edge of the board and extended his arms out, he saw his shadow on the wall. The shadow of his body in the shape of a cross. Instead of diving he knelt down and asked God to come into his life. As the young man stood back up, a maintenance man walked in and turned the lights on, the pool had been drained for repairs.

We hear of stories such as this where people have been saved by a feeling, an overriding thought. If this young diver had ignored the shadow on the wall of his out stretched arms, I think we all can conclude what the results could have been and what the maintenance man would have found. How God will speak to us, at the moments within our lives where we are standing on the edge of a cliff top experience and the only way is down.

This maybe not a true story, yet it resembles the story of life, in how it does not always go to plan -. Here in our scripture passage we have Moses, being called by God. Our story of Moses and the burning bush is well known along with how he was born and placed in a basket made of reeds and hidden in the Nile to save his life from Pharaoh's orders to kill all Hebrew sons. He is found by Pharaoh's daughter who takes pity on him and allows him to live. Giving him the

name, Moses, as she "drew him out of the water." Both incidences are signs of Gods involvement, his hands at work where events could have turned out so differently. In our Scripture story we arrive at the place where Moses is being called by God to deliver the Israelites from slavery in Egypt. God has remembered his promise to Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, in which he promised all three, land, many descendants, and a blessing from the Lord. He saw the slavery of the Israelites in Egypt and was concerned for them.

God is revealing himself to Moses, a man who was brought up by an Egyptian princess, then who killed an Egyptian, he has a bounty on his head as the King puts out an order to have him killed...Moses flees for his life. Life has turned upside down for him, and now he is on the run.

And so here we are, Moses has become a humble shepherd, looking after his father in laws sheep and goats in the land called Midian, "Years later the king of Egypt died, but the Israelites were still groaning under slavery and cried out for help. Their cry went up to God, who heard their groaning and he remembered his covenant." (Exodus 2:23-24)

God speaks to Moses, via a burning bush, the spontaneous ignition of a thorn bush in the dry desert is not out of the ordinary, yet the flames here continues as the thorn bush is not engulfed. The flame of fire is the glory of God's presence, which transforms but does not consume. It marks the presence of the angel of the Lord. Here is a manifestation Of God at work in the world, the true revelation was not the burning thorn bush, but God's word that came to Moses there. Here God calls Moses, Moses, Moses. God is calling Moses by his name, the whole concept of the Christian calling derives from the belief that God has communicated with us personally, and he calls us by our name....

I don't think it's surprising that Moses is hesitant, fearful, not sure of his own capability for this calling, he says he is weak, he stumbles over his words, who is going to take any notice of me, certainly not those in power -what he is not taking into account is God, "I shall be with you," he says, "and when you bring the people out of Egypt, you will worship me on this mountain. That will be the proof that I have sent you".

Today as we worship, isn't this proof that God is with us for we have taken up the invitation to worship him. We have had to face trials and tribulations in life and certainly I doubt not one of us would have predicted the last six months. While many of us have had a good lock-down, there are those who are suffering, mentally, and physically. Relationships breaking down, people becoming fearful and concerned for what is to come next - how will they manage to live, will we

ever get back to what it was? Today we do not look the same, we wear face masks, something which is new and can be terrifying...the two metre distancing rule is another factor which we have to put into place and remember, there are no exceptions....and as folk come into our personal space...we can begin to feel invaded and vulnerable, the hugs, the handshakes, the kisses on the cheek is a no - no , this is my space so please do not invade it - It was only last year I preached on hugging, shaking hands and welcoming...today we welcome by a smile, a nod, and kindness -some even use an elbow instead of a handshake- We even have to book a seat in church if we wish to attend a service - how life has changed. In Ecclesia- sties, there is a right and a wrong time- a time to embrace and not a time too.

Moses life changed as he was called into delivering the people of God out of Egypt and God is calling us ."The LORD said, "I have seen how my people are suffering in Egypt. I have heard them cry out because of their slave drivers. I am concerned about their suffering. ⁸ So I have come down to save them from the Egyptians. I will bring them up out of that land. I will bring them into a good land."

He sees what Is taking place within the world, not simply with the coronavirus, he sees the refugees trying to escape to a new land, one of milk and honey, people crying out to be safe, and at peace, Mary and Joseph were refugees, taking their baby, Jesus to a distant land to be safe....as we hear about the marches in America, between different cultures and races, the killing and deaths not just in our own country, around the world, God is saying as we look on in despair, "I am with you." As we go through the ups and downs of life, being diagnosed with an illness, losing our jobs, relationships breaking down, grieving loved ones, feeling alone, no one cares, searching for something, not sure what.......God says, "I am with you." At times It can be hard to believe that God is with us, we have to accept and put our belief in him. The Israelites put their trust in God as they walked on the river bed, as the waters separated as they ran for their freedom, Moses saying, "Do not be afraid, see what the Lord will do for you, today" - How can we say God is with me, if we cannot truly trust or believe in him. When the days draw in and dark nights become cold, when we feel alone and vulnerable, many will start to worry and become concerned, it is here we need to trust the words, "I am with you."

Moses heard his name being called, the young diver saw a shadow in which his body made a cross- as he knelt down, he asked God to come into his life. Sometimes God speaks to people in an audible voice (see Mark 1:11, Matthew 17:5, Acts 26:14, 1 Samuel 3). However, speaking in an audible voice is not his normal way of communicating with us today. The Lord doesn't need to use a

human voice to speak to us. He can communicate with us by putting thoughts and ideas in our minds.

I am about to play a song intitled, "On the wings of a dove"- I found a response from a couple who left this message under the youtube clip for this song, it says,

My wife and I have been married for almost 47 years. Both of us are not well. She has been battling a brain tumour and thyroid cancer. I was hit by a drunken driver, three times over the limit and have a traumatic brain injury. Since then we have had a Dove sit by our window for over a year now. When my wife speaks, it hears her and starts to making sounds...When the day breaks and when it goes down it starts making sounds. We know it must be the Lord, that sent this Dove to us. For he is telling us, we are not facing the challenges of life on our own-"I am with you." Thank you, Lord, for loving us all...In Jesus name Amen.

About Wings of a Dove

"Wings of a Dove' is a country song written by Bob Ferguson in 1958. "Wings of a Dove" was most popular when it was recorded by Ferlin Husky in 1960. The Ferlin Husky recording went to number one on the country charts for 10 nonconsecutive weeks. It was Ferlin Husky's third and final number one on the country chart, spending nine months on the chart. "Wings of a Dove" was successful on the pop charts, as well, peaking at number 12 on the Hot 100. In 1987, Broadcast Music Incorporated awarded Ferguson with the "million air" plays for the "Wings of a Dove". The song alludes to several passages from the Christian Bible about doves sent by the Lord, including a verse about God sending Noah a dove during the flood in Genesis 8:6-12. Dolly Parton's and Porter Wagoner's cover versions include a verse not in the original, referring to another passage about a dove in Matthew 3:16 where "After his baptism, as Jesus came up out of the water, the heavens were opened and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and settling on him."
