

Philip P. Bliss (b. Clearfield Ashtabula, OH, 1876) left home as a young boy to make and in lumber camps, all while trying to continuous and in lumber camps.

Philip P. Bliss (b. Clearfield County, PA, 1838; d. Ashtabula, OH, 1876) left home as a young boy to make a living by working on farms and in lumber camps, all while trying to continue his schooling. He was converted at a revival meeting at age twelve. Bliss became an itinerant music teacher, making house calls on horseback during the winter, and during the summer attending the Normal Academy of Music in Genesco, New York. His first song was published in 1864, and in 1868 Dwight L. Moody advised him to

become a singing evangelist. For the last two years of his life Bliss travelled with Major D. W. Whittle and led the music at revival meetings in the Midwest and Southern United States.

Reflection

Proverbs 1:20-22: Wisdom cries aloud in the street, in the markets she raises her voice; at the head of the noisy streets, she cries out; at the entrance of the city gates she speaks: "How long, O simple ones, will you love being simple?

Story or is it a test?

A long time ago in India there were six wise men and each of the wise men thought he knew everything there was to know. News of their great wisdom travelled far and wide throughout India until the news reached the ears of a King. He decided to offer a test to the six wise men to see if they really knew everything there was to know. In the message he added that thousands of people would attend so if they did not accept his invitation they would be seen as cowards.

Upon hearing about the King's test, the wise men all arrived at his kingdom as they had a reputation to preserve. He showed them a huge tent that he had erected in his courtyard and told them that all they had to do was to tell him what was inside the tent. "That will be easy," said the wise men.

The King replied, "Well, of course it will be easy, if you know all there is to know." The King then explained how the test was to be conducted. The tent was as big as a house and around the outside were six doorways into the tent. The wise men would each go into a different doorway but they would all be blindfolded when they entered. They would only be able to discover what was inside the tent by touch. "But this should not be a problem for you," said the King, "As you all know everything there is to know."

"Indeed!" Replied the wise men.

The first wise man was blindfolded and he entered through the first door. Inside the tent he suddenly bumped into something large and flat that stood in his way. He reached with his hands to discover that whatever it was stood as far as he could reach in either direction. He came out of the tent and said, "I know what's in the tent. It's a wall."

The second wise man then entered through the second door. He could feel something very different. In his hands he held something long and thin and flexible that felt rough to the touch with a frayed end. When he emerged from the tent he declared: "It's rope in the tent!"

Upon entering the tent through the third door the third wise man felt something long, thin, smooth and hard that bent slightly as it came to a sharp point. "It's a bent spear!" He told the King.

The fourth wise man came out and said, "I found something large and flappy that felt leathery and was high up off the ground so it must have been a flag on a pole."

The fifth wise man disagreed. When he came out of the tent he said, "It was solid and cylindrical and came up out of the ground and was very hard and rough. It is a tree trunk, or maybe a tree."

Finally, the sixth wise man went into the tent. He felt something long and slippery and bendy. He came running out of the tent and screamed, "It's a snake! I hate snakes! Aaagh!"

So, the first wise man thought it was a wall in the tent, the second wise man thought there was rope in there, the third wise man thought the King had put a bent spear in the tent, the fourth wise man thought there was a flag in there,

the fifth wise man thought it was a tree growing out of the ground and the sixth wise man thought he had met a snake in the tent.

The six wise men stood there arguing about what they thought was in the tent for a long time before one of them said, "Hey, maybe the King is trying to trick us and maybe there are six different things in the tent." They all turned to the King and said, "Are there six different things in the tent?"

"No," replied the King. "There is only one thing in the tent and you have all touched the same thing. So, tell me what it is to pass the test."

The six wise men all looked at each other quite puzzled as to what was in the tent. 'What one thing could it be,' they thought to themselves, 'that would fit all the descriptions they had given?'

Once all the wise men had said what they thought was in the tent the King gave the order for the tent to he raised. A host of soldiers pulled on some ropes at the side and the tent slowly began to rise. When the tent had risen a few feet off the ground they could all see what appeared to be four tree trunks, two at the front and two at the back, standing under the tent. Eventually the tent was raised and it was revealed that inside the tent was...?? It was an elephant! None of the wise men had guessed that it was an elephant so the King said to them that this test had proved that they did not, after all, know all there was to know.

Did you work out what it was, or were you considering cheating and going to the end of the story...? how to have knowledge and much wisdom. I personally didn't work this puzzle out. Back in the 20th century there was a study where it was noted Universities promised students that by the end of their studies they would or should have acquired wisdom...By mid-century it was not wisdom promised, Universities were calling themselves places of knowledge...and by the end of the century they had scaled down their sights even more, now promising to give aspiring students information. Of course, it all depends on the student to take up the information given and advance with it. Wisdom how we all would like a little bit more wisdom or actually some wisdom in the first place...As I sat watching the news and what was taking place in America, the attack on the "The House of Representatives", As a hoard of rioters stormed and occupied the U.S. Capitol in Washington, the words being spoken to incite such an event...wisdom you may ask, where was it... for some can be blind and foolish as they are being told lies for the good of the one who preaches. As we hear many stories of events taking place, people doing what they believe is correct, we ask ourselves where is the wisdom in it all. Today where shall we find wisdom? Where do we find that practical ability to make our way wisely through life? We live in an age where many stumble, lose their way and fall down. Our text is clearly crafted. It may have been used in Israel's wisdom literature renaissance, to instruct students in the characteristics of wisdom. You will have probably noticed that the introduction personifies Wisdom as a woman who cries out in the streets, stands and waits at the City gates where it is especially busy. This was the only way to enter or leave the city, so people had to go through the gates to attend to their fields during the day and return through the gates at night. City elders administered justice at the city gates. Prophets delivered prophecies there. Merchants conducted business there. Here Wisdom could be found, a woman selling her wares. When Lady Wisdom arrives, she cries out makes an impassioned plea—pulls out all the stops to try to persuade the foolish to move to the camp of the wise. She assumes that the situation is not hopeless—that God has provided foolish people with the capacity for wisdom that they can choose wisdom—and that their unhappy situation will reverse

itself if they do so. "How long, O simple ones, will you love being simple?" Here we have Wisdom no shrinking violet she is a teacher who actively passionately seeking out students, attempting to entice them, into the sphere of her instruction. In the hands of Wisdom all tuition is public education that dares to intrude into the realms of life, where people can be found, like the market place and the city square. Wisdom cares enough to go out to those who scoff at her and who do not like knowledge. Here she is looking, searching to demand a hearing... "I will pour out my thoughts to you, I will make my words known to you."

The purpose of the book of Proverbs is to teach us "to know wisdom and instruction, to understand words of insight, to receive instruction in wise dealings, in righteousness, justice, and equity; to give prudence to the simple, knowledge and discretion to the youth (1:2-4)." Proverbs aims to increase the learning of the wise and to give guidance to the one with understanding. This book wants to make us wise, to give us the skills and understanding to navigate life in a way that pleases God. In a way that brings us closer to God and uplifts us in times of darkness.

Our text today is best understood as a sermon although it can be hard to hear, its goal is to change the hearts and minds of the hearers". Here Lady Wisdom speaks at length about the consequences of foolishness, and as you read you will wonder why is Lady Wisdom laughing, isn't it hard to understand why laugh??


"I also will laugh at your disaster. I will mock when calamity overtakes you; when calamity overtakes you like a storm, when your disaster comes on like a whirlwind; when distress and anguish come on you."

This sounds rather inhuman and uncaring and we have to wonder what is going on...if Lady Wisdom is God, we have to ask ourselves, does He laugh at us when we are going through troubles and heart-break especially when we have been foolish...and have not listened to advice? As the rioters in America invaded the House of Representatives, I found it to be a joke. It was not funny, although I may have laughed out aloud as I sat and watched the events enfolding. It was not funny what was occurring was deadly serious, lives were put at risk and sadly life was taken...There are times when we laugh instead of crying. It isn't joyous laughter. It is the laughter of the broken heart. It is laughing to keep us from crying. Perhaps that is what is going on here. God has warned these foolish people over and over and over again—has pleaded with them—cajoled them—tried to woo them. They have rebuffed God's overtures again and again and again. At some point, they will find themselves suffering the consequences. And so what does he do, he laughs in sorrow.

Wisdom is, in fact, a divine gift that is granted by God whenever any believer asks. This is the clear teaching of James: "If any of you lacks wisdom, let him ask God, who gives generously to all without reproach, and it will be given him." James 1:5

As we moved into Level 4 and now back into lockdown for many of us, it is difficult. It might not have been a surprise, yet it was hard to hear, for so long in the Highlands we have been in level one only to be told you're going to have to stay at home, Protect the NHS. Save lives. We know there is a vaccine, there is hope, light at the end of the tunnel. It is the feeling of the lack of freedom, of being unable to be with family and friends again, going out without fear. It is putting on the tv news and hearing of how many people are dying each day, seeing our hospitals over run, worrying about our care homes, and hearing of poverty and people suffering due to this pandemic...yesterday, today and tomorrow will be the same... Lady Wisdom, says "Listening,"(v. 33a) must go beyond hearing with the ears. It must involve hearing with the heart so that the person will have an interior compass to steer away from foolish choices and toward wise choices. "But whoever listens to me will dwell securely, and will be at ease, without fear of harm" (v. 33).

The irony is that the foolish people who do silly things seem to be at ease, because they have foolishly chosen to disregard what is correct. Their current ease will therefore contribute to the disaster that awaits them we are told. But those who listen to Lady Wisdom "will dwell securely, and will be at ease, without fear of harm" (v. 33b). May the light of Christ shine down upon our foolishness for we can all do selfless and silly things which we regret latter. May we hear Lady Wisdom direct us to the one who leads us out of darkness into safety where our foolishness is washed away to a place where we laugh for joy and cry with happiness and are healed of all earthly traumas....Amen.
