
As we are called into worship today,

Christ Is Alive


Christ is alive! Let Christians sing.

Story:



Thomas' Accomplishments

Because of Thomas, we have these inspiring words of Jesus: "**Thomas, because you have seen Me, you have believed. Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed**" (John 20:29,). Thomas' lack of faith has served to encourage all future Christians who have not seen Jesus and yet have believed in him and his resurrection.





²⁴ Now Thomas (also known as Didymus^[a]), one of the Twelve, was not with the disciples when Jesus came. ²⁵ So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord!" But he said to them, "Unless I see the nail marks in his hands and put my finger where the nails were, and put my hand into his side, I will not believe." ²⁶ A week later his disciples were in the house again, and Thomas was with them. Though the doors were locked, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you!" ²⁷ Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here; see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it into my side. Stop doubting and

believe." ²⁸ Thomas said to him, "My Lord and my God!" ²⁹ Then Jesus told him, "Because you have seen me, you have believed; blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed." ³⁰ Jesus performed many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not recorded in this book. ³¹ But these are written that you may believe^[b] that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name.

**Mom Realizes Viral Photo of Boy Standing Alone
At Flagpole Is of Her Son**



When a friend urgently texted Florida mom Stacey Philpot about a Facebook post she just had to see, she wasn't sure what to expect. The post showed a teenaged boy standing alone at the flagpole and it seemed as if everyone had something to say about him. And that's when it hit Stacey - she was looking at her son! The post showed a boy standing alone at the flagpole praying as part of See You At The Pole Day. This yearly event encourages students everywhere to gather at their school's flagpole to pray for their school, friends, families, churches, and communities. Usually, the event draws a crowd. But at Minneola High School, only one young man turned up. The brave boy stood all alone, praying by himself. A passer-by was so touched, they snapped a photo and posted it to Facebook, saying:

"I commend the young man that stood alone at Lake Minneola High School's 'See You at the Pole Day.' I weld up [sic] with tears, happy tears, proud tears. I honestly didn't know that it was today until after I had left and heard it on the radio.

This boy's testimony for his faith is so inspiring!

Reality Hits Home

At first Stacey couldn't understand why her friend insisted she break her Facebook hiatus for this picture of a boy standing alone at the flag pole. Then she realized she recognized the boy everyone was talking about. That was her son!

"The little boy I'd rocked to sleep in blue airplane pyjamas when he was sick. The toddler who loved Elmo and couldn't go to sleep without holding his Veggie Tales characters in his hands had captured the attention of our community by standing alone, by doing everything we'd ever taught him, everything we'd ever hoped he would do," Stacey said. "I was completely undone."

Stacey immediately texted her son, Hayden, and told him how proud she was of him. But what he revealed when he got home was even more incredible.

Hayden was just as surprised at all of the attention as his mom. He'd originally thought he'd just pray until someone else came along. But when no one else did, he asked God to use Him.

"He told me with sheer amazement in his voice that as he stood alone and prayed the cry of his heart had been, 'God, as people drive by, let them wonder, let their hearts be pricked.' "

And boy did God answer that prayer!

There are people out there that don't understand why we pray. They see it as wasted effort. But Hayden proved just how powerful prayer truly is! And his proud mom says her son's story is a big reminder for us all.

Reflection

One Easter Sunday morning, a minister looked out on his congregation and noticed many people who had not been there for a long time attending. Before he began his sermon he said, "Since this will probably be the last time I see many of you for a while, let me be the first to wish you 'A Merry Christmas'"

As we know Easter is one of the times when people rush to church to worship God and then not be seen until Christmas eve. This Sunday is got two names, one being low Sunday for usually the number of attendees is much smaller than the previous week, Easter Sunday, and it can be called Doubting Thomas Sunday. We heard the story of Thomas a moment ago, who would have thought, if you were in the room listening to the conversation between Jesus and Thomas, that today, in the year of 2021, we would be talking about Thomas and how he would not believe until he could see the wounds in Jesus body. This is fair enough, because many today would act the same, they need to see to believe...and Thomas is no different. Through his actions what encouragement we can

receive from him. I am sure not one of us at some time or other have not had our doubts, and that many who do not believe are unable to get over the barrier of doubting. There was an article in the Times magazine which shocked many, it stated, "Mother Teresa's Crisis of Faith," it focused on a startling revelation in Mother Teresa's letters: Despite lifelong labours for God, she had struggled for years with the sense that He had abandoned her. She spoke of "silence," "emptiness," "loneliness." I should add she was not saying she had stopped believing in God. In fact, despite her feelings, Mother Teresa continued to address her prayers to the God she believed was there, even though she felt He was a distance away. Maybe some of you feel like this today...The truth is that Mother Teresa stands in good company among saints with similar struggles, and even with Jesus himself, who cried out from the cross: "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" (Mt 27:46). That cry may well help us understand Mother Teresa's enduring torment.

In September 2014 the Most Rev. Justin Welby, the archbishop of Canterbury, said that at times he questioned if God was really there. The International Business Times called it "the doubt of the century." Archbishop Welby's admission had not just "raised a few eyebrows," it declared, but "sparked concerns if the leader of the Church of England would one day renounce Christianity or spirituality as a whole." Another journalist wrote excitedly, "Atheism is on the rise and it appears as though even those at the top of the church are beginning to have doubts." Despite the alarm, the archbishop's remarks were rather tame. He told an audience at Bristol Cathedral that there were moments where he wondered, "Is there a God? Where is God?" Then, he was asked specifically, if he harboured doubts, his response, "It is a really good question. ... The other day I was praying over something as I was running, and I ended up saying to God, 'Look, this is all very well, but isn't it about time you did something, if you're there?'"

I think many of us who are in the driving seat, as a leader of whatever, can begin to get frustrated and begin to wonder why God is putting me through the ringer, while some keep putting barriers up, we so clearly believe he has given us a vision. I wonder if Jesus ever felt like this as he taught the disciples. At times he says you do not understand do you, you don't get it...and they didn't until it was far too late..the Crucifixion had taken place and the resurrection

was occurring. The Australian atheist columnist Peter FitzSimons tweeted, "VICTORY!" after hearing Justin Welby's confession...At times we can wonder where God is and why has he placed us in a position which seems to be pointless, where nobody is listening. We have to believe that God is working and using us for his glory and Kingdom...for his Will shall be done.

Archbishop Welby's candour only makes him human. He may lead 80 million Anglicans worldwide, but he is also a man who knows anguish, rage, incomprehension and the cold bareness of grief. He lost his firstborn child, Johanna, a 7-month-old baby girl, in a car accident in 1983, a period he has described as "utter agony." As a teenager he cared for an alcoholic father. When explaining his thoughts on doubt, he referred to the mournful Psalm 88, which describes the despair of a man who has lost all of his friends and cries out, "Why, Lord, do you reject me and hide your face from me?" The psalm reads bleakly: "Darkness is my closest friend."

When you are stuck in darkness, it can be suffocating and faith cannot block it out yet the darkness we may be feeling will disappear one day and light shall be upon us...it already is surrounding us now, although it is hard to see it in times of despair...so many people have or do feel like this. Yet through faith we can believe that the dark days will vanish and so it won't seem that we're walking alone, even though at times I know it can feel very lonely...The disciples felt distraught, they lived in darkness after the crucifixion, then the light reappeared...it was Jesus.


Faith cannot block out darkness, or doubt. When on the cross, Jesus did not cry out "Here I come!" but "My God, why have you forsaken me?" His disciples brimmed with doubts and misgivings.

For Thomas, the one who doubted, he was the one who said to the disciples, go with Jesus no matter what the danger, this was after Jesus had returned to Judea and his life was at risk. And it was Thomas who was honest with Jesus and the disciples for he admitted, "Lord, we don't know where you are going, so how can we know the way?" (John 14:5, NIV). One of the most memorized verses in all the Bible, Jesus answers, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me" (John 14:6).

Like the other disciples, Thomas was no different for he deserted Jesus during the crucifixion. Despite listening to his teachings and seeing all his miracles, and as we well know, at the resurrection Thomas demanded physical proof that Jesus had risen from the dead. I think we may have done the same...His faith was based solely on what he could touch and see for himself. All of the disciples, except John, deserted Jesus at the cross. They misunderstood and doubted Jesus, but Thomas is singled out in the gospels because he put his doubt into words. Jesus did not rebuke for he loved him, and he showed unconditional love which he so freely gives, for Jesus knew Thomas was having a human struggle, human being the word. In fact, Jesus invited Thomas to touch his wounds and see for himself. Jesus does understand our battles with doubt, with depression, with stress and feeling helpless, for he invites us to come near and believe. Something many people cannot seem to do. God provides the Bible, with eyewitness accounts of Jesus' life, crucifixion, and resurrection to strengthen our faith. Today, speaking with people, we can hear personal testimonies of God in action...yet people who seem to lack in faith dismiss...because their minds are on the worldly, and not on the spiritual. You know they will never understand until they take a leap of faith. And as a minister friend said to me not that long ago, until they get rid of their personal ego this which stops them being Christ centred.

If we are honest with ourselves, then we will admit that there are times when we possess doubt as Thomas did. I know, I have...let us remember when Jesus came to Thomas and told him to put his finger in the holes due to the crucifixion scars, Thomas began to believe. In much the same way, God uses our faith to help others to develop the eyes of faith so that they, too, may begin to believe without having to rely on sight. They see us having peace that passes all understanding in spite of the trials of everyday life. It is then that our faith becomes a living testimony of trusting and believing in the resurrected Christ so that unbelievers might want to have the faith that also gives us hope in knowing that Christ holds our future just as much as He helps us in the present.




