What Verse four is actually saying is to place a tay on the foreheads of the righteous inhabitants of Jerusalem, a mark. The word is tav the old form of which was a cross. And so, upon the foreheads—the most conspicuous part of the person, to imply how their safety would be manifested to all. It was customary thus to mark worshippers and servants. As you know many churches like us within the Church of Scotland when baptizing a child or adult, the minister makes a mark on their forehead, a sign of the cross after the minister dips is finger into the holy water. And if we look back at the book of exodus there was a mark was on the houses, for then it was families; here, it is on the foreheads, for it is individuals whose safety is guaranteed. A mark to when the servants of God are sealed. We are told the mark was made by an angel with a writing kit, was to mark as special those who were broken hearted over sin." There is much stress laid upon this use of the sign of the cross as the mark for the Divine mercy by the older Christian writers, such as Tertullian, Origen, and Jerome. This marking was done, it is true, in vision, but the symbolism is taken from such passages as Genesis 4:15; "But the Lord said to him, "Not so; anyone who kills Cain will suffer vengeance seven times over." Then the Lord put a mark on Cain so that no one who found him would kill him."

A mark is used many times within the bible to identify... It is clear, however, that there could be no anticipation of the Christian symbolism in the minds of Ezekiel or of his hearers. The "mark" was to be placed on all who were still faithful to the worship of their fathers, though they could show their faithfulness only by lamentation of the national apostasy.

If we walk along the roads and see sheep in the fields, or on the hillside we will notice a mark is given to identify them. When you think of ewes, say half a field away, ewes will know their lambs and lambs recognise their known mothers by their bleats. But if you are a farmer rather than a sheep, then you need another practical, quick, and simple way to identify your sheep. (Saying this, many shepherds will recognise their sheep without having a mark.) If you have seen sheep on the hills, or in the fields, I am sure you will have noticed the paint marks on their fleeces. They are *smit marks* and farmers have been using them for hundreds of years to identify who sheep belong to. A daub of paint - perhaps two marks of red or one of black - nearer the haunch or the shoulder. From these a farmer would know which were his sheep and which belonged to his

neighbour. In the 21st century, sheep are required by law to have digital tags implanted under the skin. Their main use is to identify a sheep when disease strikes, and action needs to be taken quickly. Today our pets, dogs and cats are tagged, I am identified by a marker of my role, the dog collar, (although it seems to become rather rare with some). We recognise a nurse by her uniform along with the Police, fire brigade, a chef in whites is known as a person who cooks food...and so on. We often talk about big brother is watching, with CTV cameras all over the place, yet we forget many of us walk about with an obvious mark of what we work as. As Christians we have a mark upon our hearts it might be an invisible mark, yet by how we act or re-act to situations, the mark of God can become very much visible.

If we think back to our reading, in verse one God summonses six angels who had been the guardian angels of the city, and told them to bring their weapons ... to become the instruments of God's divine wrath. They came from the North ... indicating that God would send punishment from the North = Babylon. God also called a seventh angel with a writing kit... a leader to record the events. When doom falls upon a people, God's will for those who have opposed the evil in that community is not their safety but their redemption. He does not take them out of the agony of their generation but calls them to enter into it with him. For he too can be found in it, not as a mere judge, he takes it on his heart in sympathy and fellow suffering. The true servants of God do not ask for exemption, but only that they may so accept their share in the tragic events of their time that they may be able to turn the bad times into good, first in themselves and then in the community with which they are so closely bound. God does indeed set a mark upon their foreheads, but it is a sign that he elects them to a share in his redemptive pain. If we understand this, we can look upon the fate of Jerusalem with other eyes than those of the prophet. We know that enough men and women emerged from catastrophe to carry on God's work. They signed and cried for the sins of the old city, but they bore in their hearts the hope of a new one, and their children returned to build it. In them the purpose of redemption was fulfilled. That was because they shared to the uttermost what came to their people. Would it have been fulfilled had they been given safety? We may doubt it.

A minister, while crossing the Bay of Biscay, became greatly alarmed as he beheld what he thought was an approaching hurricane. Trembling, he addressed himself to one of the sailors: "Do you think the ship will be able to go through it?" "Through what?" inquired the sailor. "That awful hurricane that is coming down upon us." The old sailor smiled and said: "That storm will never touch us. It has passed us already." So, in regard to the believer, judgment as to the penalty of our sins is past. We were tried, condemned, and executed in the person of

our Surety, Jesus Christ. The mark is on our hearts, that we have been forgiven and as we know none of us are ever perfect...we try to be, yet fail. There are the times when we know and have said, my goodness, I have let myself down in how I reacted, I should think before I speak or act, I may have not allowed God's love to shine through. There will be many occasions when we have thought afterwards, the marker of God is upon me, the cross of Christ and it can be seen yet have I actually honoured that mark, Christ whose life was a shining example. Maybe we should take more time to think about the mark which is upon us, the mark of love, of strength, the mark of guidance, the mark of forgiveness, the mark which says we are one of Gods people and we do not put ourselves first. Isn't it wonderful to think with the mark we have, it can bring us closer to God our creator the one who has set his mark on us through the cross and is on our hearts, freely and willingly offering redemption to us?

6/I wish people would spend less money on lavish things and instead fund causes like this.

7/Here we are, watching videos on YouTube while these kids don't even have a safe ceiling on top of their heads...

8/ This is heart breaking, made me cry. Children deserve to be children. I am in awe of how these kids continue to go to school. Education (and seeing their friends), - the importance of having some form of continuity is so important even in this pandemic yet alone a war zone. The kid teaching is amazing, bless him. They still have hope despite their circumstances. As an educator, it serves as a reminder of the hope that education brings. Prayer: Dear God, thank you for the opportunity to be able to speak with you here today, for the connection we can have with you and for how you answer our prayers because you know what truly is needed of the world and ourselves. At times when we pray we feel you do not listen, deep down we know this is not true for you answer each prayer in the way you feel is correct.

O Lord, as we hear about Ahmed and his friends in Yemen, we feel helpless, unsure what we can do. We ask you to help us to be able to help them.
