

One day Peter and John were going up to the temple at the time of prayer—at three in the afternoon. Now a man who was lame from birth was being carried to the temple gate called Beautiful, where he was put every day to beg from those going into the temple courts. When he saw Peter and John about to enter, he asked them for money. Peter looked straight at him, as did John. Then Peter said, "Look at us!" So, the man gave them his attention, expecting to get something from them. Then Peter said, "Silver or gold I do not have, but what I do have I give you. 

Reflection

Rome wasn't built in one day. Life needs long-term commitment which involves sacrifices, devotion, pain, frustration and a strong mindset. But what's the most challenging and hardest part of this struggle, it's the start. Just like the first step in baby's walk, it can be hard but things will be easier. If you are crazy to get success here are some baby first walk quotes that might help you to be motivated: Do not give up, the beginning is always the hardest, keep moving forward. Winners never quit, and quitters never win. The first step to living thr life you want, is leaving the life you don't want. Taking that first step forward is always the hardest. But then each step forward gets easier and easier. And each step forward gets you closer and closer to your goal. Eventually what had once been invisible, starts to be visible, and what had once felt impossible, starts to feel possible.

Today in our reading from Acts, Peter heals a lame beggar. Here is a person who had waited a long time to be healed, if he had ever thought it might happen. Here we encounter a beggar whose existence was only at the hands of others, begging for money. The name, gender, age, and nationality of the beggar is not given to readers. At this time the marginalized, homeless, and poor child of God was always at the entrance of the Temple, begging, waiting to receive help. Each day, the paralytic expected people to help meet daily needs, and on this day, Peter and John demonstrated that healing through the name and in the power of Jesus brings new life. The work of the Holy Spirit is at work within Acts and we as believers should always remember that all the miracles of healing were done in the name of the risen Lord. In the modern world, healing through the name of Jesus is hardly believed by many people, yet in Acts we see

disciples performing miracles of all kinds. Today many struggle with miracles, and many will say it is not a miracle there has to be some sort of reason, explanation behind this act of healing, yet there are people who have been healed through prayer in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. It would not be correct to ignore the fact that along with that sentence, many have not been healed, people have prayed for themselves or others. Maybe healing comes in many ways, and not what we expect.

The Jewish ethic was one that honoured the poor and sought to lift them up, not condemn them. This was very strange to other cultures in the 1st century. Other cultures saw the poor and crippled as deserving their lot in life because it was the result of some sin they committed. Some Jews also believed this about the poor yet they were commanded to care for them. Even though the beggar was looking for money, Peter and John had no money. The disciples and Jesus were not wealthy but what they did have was the power of the name of Jesus which is the name that they called upon to heal the beggar. In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, rise up and walk! (Acts 3:6) After the healing, the beggar entered the Temple with the disciples, can you imagine the scene it must have been. For he got up and walked, and walked into the temple jumping for joy and praising God. My father who had polio as a teenager after medication and a long time in hospital had to learn to walk...he told me it was baby steps he had to take, there was no great moment of jumping for joy. As he learnt to take step after step, and I am sure with much exhaustion eventually after a long period of exercise and learning how to walk, he was able to leave his wheel chair, and crutches and walk. We often learn of bells being rung in hospital wards when a patient leaves cured...the healing process usually is a step by step process, yet here we have man who is told to get up and walk in the name of Jesus of Nazareth and he can walk with joy, a slow process it is not, yet it was many years before he became healed. Can we imagine what he would have learnt during this period..??

I think for sure the disciples would have been recognized at the temple for the congregation on this day would have surely known the disciples, who they were, and that they were with the recently crucified Jesus. Have you ever thought, isn't it interesting that the disciples still seemed to follow the Law. They observed and obeyed the set times for prayer as new born children of God. They arrived at the Temple in time to join in with others at the afternoon hour of prayer when this meeting took place. And of-course with such a display of healing and joy in the Lord, this would certainly have not gone unnoticed, and infuriated the Temple leaders the very people who had Jesus handed over to be crucified.

When the beggar saw Peter and John that day, I'm sure he never thought a miracle would take place for it was a day like all the rest as far as he was concerned. He would be carried to the gate of the Temple and as the worshippers would come and go, He would ask them if they could spare a penny or two for a lame man. He had gotten good at asking/begging for money. It's all he'd ever done; it's all he could do. He thought money was his greatest need in his life. He thought he would be on that matt for the rest of his life. He thought things would always be like they are. He never gave other things much thought because laying on that matt was all he'd ever known.

And here, was the start of a new day, a new beginning for the beggar. For he was healed, and was able to leave his matt behind, and rejoice and celebrate, worshipping God, giving praise to him.

As newly parents, one night a wife found her husband standing over their infant's crib. As she watched him looking down at their very first baby, she saw on his face a mixture of emotions: disbelief, doubt, delight, amazement, enchantment, scepticism. Touched by this unusual display and deep emotions, with eyes glistening she slipped her arm around her husband. "A penny for your thoughts," she said. "It's amazing" he replied. "I just can't see how anybody can make a crib like that for only £46.50." What's that saying? Some people can't see the forest for the trees. Sometimes when you concentrate on the details of a problem, you lose sight of the overall picture; in other words, you focus on the unimportant, rather than on the important things. You miss the big picture. I think the beggar focussed on what he was needing, money to buy food, to live..as he sat on the steps of the temple...a place where people inside worshipped God. As Peter walked past, in the name of Jesus get up. We often forget that in the name of Jesus all can be done...it is not always done as quickly as the healed man got off his matt..it can be step by step, quietly over time . When we look back at instances and wondered, has God answered our prayers in Jesus's name, yes, they have been, yet maybe not in the time we wanted in the way we wished...In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, rise up and walk! I have been told that babies change our lives and of course they do, for bringing that new-born into your home changes everything; nothing will remain the same. As we bring Jesus into our lives, things change, for we become different in such a way that actually folk will recognise we are different. For the lame man, Jesus entered his life and he got up and walked and praised Him. In the situations we have been praying for, it may take baby steps with much prayer, in God's time our prayers are answered...The answer can be do we see or are we blind to the fact...God, in the name of Jesus is working in our lives and the world.




