<u>A rolling stone gathers no moss</u>

Mick Jagger, Charlie Watts who has sad died in in August 2021, Keith Richards, and Ronnie Wood - The Rolling Stones - have played together for more than 50 years. However, they recognize the importance of practicing together.

They understand that for excellence to become a habit, you need to define a shared approach to working together. You need to practice it over and over until it becomes second nature.

Before every tour, the band typically commits two months to rehearsing. They appreciate the opportunity to reconnect with their collective rhythm. The practice enables the band to perform with almost telepathic communication.

Keith Richards says that he knows exactly what's happening by simply watching Charlie Watts' left hand. If the tempo ever drags, one glance from Richards to Wood speaks volumes. Together they will then step up the pace.

The Stones' success comes from each member having a distinctive yet complementary role. Richards is their spiritual leader, Watts was the band's backbone, Wood the mediator, and Jagger is in control of everything he can be - a chief executive in many ways.

Each of the band's members is a talent in his own right, but it is the chemistry the band has on each of them that works best. Being part of the Rolling Stones remains the best way for each member to achieve their individual goals. The best teams are those who combine

individual drive with understanding the importance and power of the team and you know my friends this is what we are in Christ, a team that is part of a family called Gods family.

You know we can learn from the Rolling stones, the secret to becoming an excellent team: There is no substitute for the ongoing commitment and deliberate practice required to build a better team and this is what we have been called to do... Our reading this morning is one of the most famous pictures of the unity of the Church that has ever been written. People have always been fascinated by the way in which different parts of the body co-operate. St Paul draws on the picture as the church as a body, one body, Christs body. Now the body consists of many parts but there is in it an essential unity.

1 Corinthians 12 : 12-31

But God has put the body together, giving greater honour to the parts that lacked it, 25 so that there should be no division in the body, but that its parts should have equal concern for each other. 26 If one part suffers, every part suffers with it; if one part is honoured, every part rejoices with it. 27 Now you are the body of Christ, and each one of you is a part of it. 28 And God has placed in the church first of all apostles, second prophets, third teachers, then miracles, then gifts of healing, of helping, of guidance, and of different kinds of tongues. ²⁹ Are all apostles? Are all prophets? Are all teachers? Do all work miracles? 30 Do all have gifts of healing? Do all speak in tongues [d]? Do all interpret? 31 Now eagerly desire the greater gifts. Reflection

You will never have guessed it I am sure, that when I was at school I was normally the one who was last to be picked in team sports I even heard one captain say to the other after they had chosen the second last person, you can have him also on your team as he pointed to me.. I know, I couldn't believe my natural football skills hadn't shone through in previous games lessons...and I may had I resisted showing off my Ronaldo talent. I learnt a lesson our abilities at times are not seen by some or that we are not always good at everything. For sure I took great pleasure on cross country long distance runs out lapping the football team and up and coming school rugby stars. Yes, my talent was running and I might not have been fast but I had endurance, even today as a grown up I have felt a bit like the school lad standing on the lines watching the game even though I am meant to be playing...it happens where our talents and abilities are not seen by others. The church is no exception and I know many people worship wondering will they ever be asked to take part, to help with events and be made to feel part of the family. The church is changing, and we are all part of this new dawn that is around the corner. Whatever our age, lets remember Moses was called into service in his 80's, so there is scope for us all even me at my ripe old age. Do you hear that ?? do you, that is God calling, and thankfully he does not leave anyone on the side lines watching. He created, gave gifts and expects us to serve, we are all part of the family, and as the Liverpudlian mother in the program Bread use to repeat often to her youngest son, Billy your part of the family, that is what we are part of the family of God and thankfully when some may be blind to our talents God can see them for, he is the one who gave them to US...

In the passage that I just read, Paul was dealing with a problem. He was writing to the little church at Corinth—a church which he had established—a church that he loved—but a church that had problems. So, Paul wrote a God inspired letter giving them guidance—to get them on the right path again.

One of their problems was spiritual pride. Each of the Christians had different gifts—different talents—and some of them were acting as if they were more important than the others because of their gifts.

The gift that seemed to be giving them the greatest problem was speaking in tongues. Shortly after Jesus' resurrection, Jews from all over the world gathered in Jerusalem for the Day of Pentecost—a great Jewish holy day. On that day, the apostle Peter became a street preacher, and preached to the great crowd about Jesus.

There were two strange things about Peter's sermon. First of all, the people listened. They didn't ignore Peter the way most people today ignore street preachers. The second strange thing was that all the people—from many different nations—all heard Peter's sermon in their own language.

It was a little bit like the United Nations, where one person can speak in Chinese and another can listen on headphones to an almost simultaneous translation into English. Except that Peter had no electronic apparatus and no translators. God had worked a miracle, and everyone heard in their own language. That was the first instance of speaking in tongues.

In the early church, other people also spoke in tongues. Sometimes people could understand them. Sometimes, their language was gibberish. But they were proud that they could speak in tongues, and tended to think that anyone who could not do so was not as good as they. Paul was writing this chapter in large measure to answer these people. Paul said that:

Every Christian has his or her own gifts. Some were prophets. Some were teachers. Some spoke in tongues. Some had other gifts.

Then he said that all these gifts are important to the church. The church is like a human body, and its different members are like a hand or a foot or an eye. Each of those organs is important to the human body, and each Christian's gifts are important to the church.

Therefore, we should treasure each other's' gifts. If our gift is teaching, we should be glad that someone else has the gift of music—or administration—or preaching—or speaking in tongues.

Therefore, we should share each other's' sorrows and rejoice in each other's' joys—because we, the church, are all one body. You are the arm; someone else is the leg; someone else is the eye. But all the pieces fit together to form one body—meaning the church. Every part of the body needs every other part, and if one-part hurts, they all hurt.

"The King's Highway" Once a king had a great highway built for the members of his kingdom. After it was completed, but before it was opened to the public, the king decided to have a contest. He invited as many as desired to participate.

Their challenge was to see who could travel the highway the best. On the day of the contest the people came. Some of them had fine chariots; some had fine clothing, fine hairdos, or brought along great food. Some young men came in their track clothes and ran along the highway. People travelled the highway all day, but each one, when he arrived at the end, complained to the king that there was a large pile of rocks and debris left on the road at one spot and this got in their way and hindered their travel. At the end of the day, a lone traveller crossed the finish line warily and walked over to the king. He was tired and dirty, but he addressed the king with great respect and handed him a bag of gold, he explained, "I stopped along the way to

clear a pile of rocks and debris that was blocking the road. This bag of gold was under it all.

I want you to return it to its rightful owner." The king replied, "You are the rightful owner."

The traveller replied, "Oh no, this is not mine. I've never known such money." "Oh yes," said the king, "you've earned this gold, for you won my contest.

He who travels the road best is he who makes the road smoother for those who will follow." That was respecting his King and the ones who followed him. Isn't it that by respecting someone is a way of worship? Today we have come together to worship, one of the first steps to move our parishes into a Union with each other...we are asked to accept the new Presbytery plan and I believe by doing this we are respecting God. For what is taking place today is done in God's name a vision which came about through much prayer. Whether we like it or not we have free will to be part of it or not...the reality as the plan goes out there are people going to struggle with it and find it hard to accept. As the Moderator of the General assembly wrote in a daily newspaper last week, we are a minority being Christians in Scotland today. It used to be we lived in a Christian country now folk are non-believers or followers of other faiths...I think I am correct in saying only 7% attend church. The Church is in dire straits and we need to move and change now or else there will be nothing to build on later. ...there is no point waiting for the next generation for there won't be anything to hand over if we do not act today. There is uncertainty and sadness and anger, when worship centres close and congregations are asked to come together. This is only natural for our worship centres mean a lot to us. There will be folk who leave the church, some while dig in their heels and resist while others will take the bull by the horns and pray and through the holy spirit move forward for if we do not there won't be a church locally or nationally. Today we have the opportunity to grow together and build on what we have already so that there is a church family to

pass onto the next generation. My prayer is that the next generation will be part of this plan. We all have a role to play... I cannot do this on my own as I have already said, and I will not. We all have an important part to play, we are all part of the same body, whether we live or worship in Cawdor, Croy, Daviot or Tomatin. Our church is going to change, we can fear it, walk away from it, or grab it with all our love for God and go with it and make it work. As St Paul says to the Corinthians, "we were all baptized into one body"—Christ's body—the church. We are all part of one another. Therefore, let us not lord it over other Christians because of our gifts and selfimportance and what we have ... Instead, let us rejoice together over each other's' gifts and be together... We have a great opportunity to make new friends and walk with God. Are we able to remove the pile of rocks from the middle of our road that is stopping us, so that we can build on our future together? For if we can, our worship could change the world around us showing Gods glory in so many new and wonderful ways.

The three Musketeers creed, a phrase that emphasizes solidarity and support within a family group in which they will support its members and its members will support the group. "All for one and one for all". I will leave this with you, "What we are is God's gift to us.

What we become is our gift to God." Use your gifts for His work and His Kingdom. Ask His blessing on your gifts. I guarantee you that He will answer that prayer. We all have gifts that God calls us to not ignore..gifts that can make our new united church plan work so I want you to take time to reflect on the gifts you bring...one gift I pray you can do is the gift of encouragement. Help those who cannot see the way forward, I pray for enthusiasm to override the desire for yesterday for that day has gone, we are in the now and let us hold onto what God will do...lets rejoice for God is good and He has blessed us. As so many have left the church and walked away from the love of Jesus, Our God has remained with those of us who have not, and he is calling usdo you hear that...??? Can you hear the child in the dark crying, searching for God...how can he get know Him

if we are not there to introduce our Lord and Saviour to all who do not know Him? In the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit three in one as we are all one together in Him. Amen.
